

# What You Can Do

### **GET INFORMED**

How does your school's arts programs compare to the national average? Use this checklist based on top-level findings from the Snapshot of Arts Access in U.S. Schools (2009-10 FRSS) to start a conversation in your community. Note that matching these basic national norms does not necessarily mean that a school district is providing the support structures needed for a complete arts education. Consider adding your own questions that look to whether the instruction is sufficient to provide comprehensive, standards-based learning (such as a higher level of frequency of instruction).
