____#1: Chuck Davis Traditions 8:30 – 11:30 am
Experience African traditional dance forms with Baba Chuck
Davis and drummers. Baba Chuck will explore some of the many
dances and chants of West Africa, contextualized in the rich cultural
background of the area. Called a "living treasure," Baba Chuck has
extensive knowledge and experience in the traditional dances and
their application to dance as an art in education.

___ #2: Pedagogy Higher Ed

1:00 - 4:00 pm

Reviving Your Pedagogy: Strategies & Resources for Dance Pedagogy in Higher Education

Julie Kerr-Berry, Ed.D. and Doug Risner, Ph.D.

Based on response to last year's "Teacher Identity" pedagogy panel presented at Towson University, this intensive professional development session focuses on participants' personal pedagogy and meaningful approaches for revitalizing dance educators' teaching in the daily classroom and studio in higher education. Participants will also build/re-build a working syllabus and course outline for dance pedagogy coursework appropriate for their own particular institution and needs. Resources for registered participants will be available free-of-charge on a dedicated website prior to and following the conference.

#3: **Eric Franklin Plié** 1:00 – 4:00 pm

Art of the plié. The plié is one of the most common movements in dance and yet, if you question a group of dance students why they perform this movement daily in their training, you will get a wide range of often contradictory answers. This workshop will provide practical experience of the subtle but important coordination of the legs and pelvis which will lead to improved stability, flexibility and alignment in the plié and in dance overall. Following a brief introduction into the anatomy of the pelvis and legs, specific imagery and self-touch exercises will be presented that instantly create increased safety for the lower back, knees and feet in the plié along with an experience of improved technique and greater ease in movement.

_____#4: Chuck Davis K-12 Curriculum 5:00 – 8:00 pm Chuck Davis will introduce Dance Across the Curriculum® (DXC) a "train-the-teacher" arts-in-education program that integrates dance and other arts with curriculum based instruction". Dance Across the Curriculum® (DXC) is a teacher focused train-the-trainer program introduced by the Chuck Davis African American Dance Ensemble (AADE).

#5: Eric Franklin Jumping 5:00 – 8:00 pm

Fabulous Feet, Effortless Jumping! In dance as in life the strength and agility of the feet are key; without strong and well aligned feet good posture cannot be attained and safe jumping is all but impossible. This workshop will explore the function of the foot in an experiential manner, allowing for improved agility and well being of the feet in all situations. Participants will: 1) understand the functional anatomy of the foot, 2) learn imagery and self-touch exercises to improve the efficiency of the bones, tendons, muscles and joints in the feet and ankles for more flexible and agile feet, and 3) practice exercises to strengthen the muscles of the foot and ankle.

___ #6: ABT Curriculum

The ABT National Training Curriculum is a program for the development and training of young students that embraces sound ballet principles and incorporates elements of the French, Italian and Russian schools of training. The ABT National Training Curriculum, written in collaboration with ABT's Artistic Staff and a Medical Advisory Board, aims to assist beginning through advanced teachers in training dance students to use their bodies correctly. Artistically, the National Training Curriculum strives to provide dance students with a rich knowledge of classical ballet technique and the ability to adapt to all styles and techniques of dance. This introductory workshop will feature an overview of the progressions and philosophy of the ABT National Training Curriculum. The principles and ideas introduced are designed to be applied to the teaching of recreational as well as pre-professional dancers. The workshop will be presented by one of ABT's distinguished faculty.

___ #7: Master Artists Workshop

NDEO artists 50 and over are welcome to join this collaborative workshop directed by Sabatino Verlezza with Suzanne Oliver. Dancers will be led through a choreographic process that will result in a site specific performance in the Atrium of LaGuardia Arts High School. The work will be performed on Saturday afternoon June 27th as part of the closing NDEO reception.

#8: Passing on the Legacy

___ #9: Mary Anthony

9:30 - 11:30 am

Renowned modern dance choreographer and teacher, Mary Anthony, will share her lifetime of experience and expertise with NDEO participants in a master class which will allow the participant to become familiar with her technique, her choreographic style, and the learning process that we engage in as students and as educators. Ms. Anthony was Hanya Holm's personal assistant, and danced in her company, as well as with Joseph Gifford and The New Dance Group. She taught dance at The New Dance Group and movement for actors at The Herbert Berghof Studio.

#10: **Cunningham Workshop** 1:00 – 3:00 pm

The Cunningham Repertory Understudy Group, with MCDC's Director of Education Mary Lisa Burns and a musician from the Merce Cunningham Studio, will lead a two-hour in-depth workshop on the work and ideas of Merce Cunningham. There will be a performance of an Event by Merce Cunningham performed by the group, followed by time for Q&A with the dancers. Participants will view a presentation created for use in schools on Mr. Cunningham's use of DanceForms. They will have the opportunity to create dances using phrases created with Dance Forms and chance operations, as well as to participate in a Cunningham technique warm-up.

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____#11: **Chuck Davis Jam Session** 1:00 – 4:00 pm (Wed) Dancers and musicians: come dance and make music with Baba Chuck Davis! Delight in improvisation, call and response, and the thrill of fusing West African-based dances with your own elaborations and embellishments. Session culminates in an exciting drum circle.
